Greetings Law Alumni

As we continue the fundraising for a new law school building that will occupy the corner of Washburn Avenue and 21st Street, I am pleased to announce that the Washburn University board of regents has approved a new \$33 million budget for our building project and authorized architects to proceed with a redesign of a new law school building. Accordingly, we are working with the architects to redesign the building to meet the needs of our groundbreaking program of legal education. As you may know, Washburn University School of Law is the first law school in the country to permit law students to complete the third year of law school in the city or town where the student intends to practice after graduation and passing the bar. We call this innovative enrollment option our Third Year Anywhere. I have spoken about this curricular innovation at the ABA annual meeting and the AccessLex Annual Symposium. When I share what our faculty has done with this curricular innovation, I am met with much enthusiasm for our faculty's leadership in legal education. We have been referred to as the change legal education needs which should make us all very proud.

To be the success that we intend our new curriculum to be, we will need a new facility with state-of-the-art technology that includes a one button recording studio for faculty members to record and upload lectures for online courses. We will need classrooms with integrated technology that includes cameras and microphones that make synchronized broadcast of class sessions possible and that make lecture capture possible. We will not need a law library as large as originally contemplated because most research resources are now available electronically and we can be better stewards of financial resources by not duplicating all of those resources in print. Consequently, I am excited to have the faculty, staff and students give input to the architects to help them redesign a law school building that meets our needs and reflects the cutting-edge work that is being done by our faculty inside the building.

I want to say thank you to everyone who has contributed to the law school building campaign. All donors are listed at wualumni.org/newlawbuildingdonors. This donor webpage will be converted to a donor recognition screen that will be in the new law school building. The University commitment to our project remains at \$20 million and we have raised more than \$10 million so far putting us only \$3 million away from our fundraising goal. This is the largest amount raised for a single project in the history of Washburn University. Collaborating, Connections, Competition

Married couple coach trial advocacy team at Washburn Law.

For Jay and Danielle Hall, Washburn University School of Law's trial advocacy program is the gift that keeps on giving. **Jay, BA '04, JD '07**, and **Danielle, BA '06, JD '09**, each participated in the program while attending law school, and the married couple has been coaching trial advocacy teams together since 2010. Collaborating as coaches has not only helped their careers, but it has also enhanced their relationship, which began when they were both undergraduates at Washburn.

"As coaches, Jay and I have two different personality types," Danielle said. "In a sense, we kind of complete each other – I'm organized and I like to have a plan, and he can be spontaneous. We balance each other. Also, being able to share in those

moments where we see a student accomplish something that they had doubts in whether they could do is something we both enjoy very much. It's special when you get to share that experience with your spouse."

While some aspiring trial lawyers may start law school uncertain of their ability to effectively argue a case, the trial advocacy program gives students the opportunity to broaden their skills by developing and presenting hypothetical cases in a competitive format. As students, Jay and Danielle both did well in competitions, and the experience they gained has helped them flourish in successful careers.

“Even though I’m not a practicing trial attorney, advocacy is something that I do on a very regular basis,” said Jay, who works as legislative policy director and general counsel at the Kansas Association of Counties. “I tell our students that advocacy skills will always travel with you, no matter where you go or what kind of job you end up in. That’s been one of the rewarding things about teaching and maintaining these skills.”

“Trial skills can transfer over into life skills. We often talk about having direction, intent, and purpose in trial, but those same ideas can be applied every day in life.” added Danielle, who serves as deputy disciplinary administrator for the Kansas Office of the Disciplinary Administrator and received the Graduate of the Last Decade Award from the Washburn University School of Law Alumni Association in October. “It was bigger than just learning the trial skills. The advice that I could seek from my coaches was definitely helpful throughout law school and when I was trying to determine what to do on my own career path.”

After their own positive experiences with the trial advocacy program, Jay and Danielle are excited to help students enhance their legal prowess. Both naturally competitive, Jay and Danielle jumped at the chance to participate in the law school’s intensive trial advocacy program, which immerses students in trial practice for seven full days. Their involvement has only increased from there, including traveling with the team to national competitions.

“It’s pretty much like coaching a sports team,” Jay said. “You recruit your team, and after that you strategize and prepare for competition. That entails practicing – we practice things like opening statements, closing arguments, direct and cross-examinations. We go through legal theories and practice presentation skills.”

While participating in national competitions, Jay and Danielle have made lasting memories with their teams. Jay will never forget the first time their team advanced to the finals during his tenure as coach in 2015 – a big deal, considering anywhere from 50 to 100 students participate in the competitions, and only the top four teams advance.

“The reaction of the students when they heard their team called is something that will stick with me,” Jay said. “There was a moment of silence followed by, ‘Wait – that’s us.’ The year before we’d had a lot of the same students and we didn’t advance, so coming back and being able to advance was pretty nice.”

Danielle has also enjoyed leading the law school’s team to victory in the UMKC School of Law’s national voir dire

competition, which was the first of its kind in the country when it began six years ago. The competition teaches students about the voir dire process, including the essential skill of jury selection. Coached by Jay and Danielle, Washburn students won the competition in 2016.

Even more valuable than career success and competitive victories have been the lasting relationships Jay and Danielle have established with their students. Each year they receive Christmas cards, and they’ve been invited to several students’ weddings. They also readily offer advice and guidance to former students, continuing the tradition of mentorship they received at Washburn.

“The connection we make with our students is pretty amazing,” Danielle said. “Watching them develop their skill sets from becoming a law student to passing the bar and becoming a lawyer is remarkable as a coach to see. We continue to have relationships with them when they graduate. They’re not afraid to give me a call and seek advice.”

“Seeing our former students go out and become good lawyers is the most rewarding thing for me,” Jay added. “I talk to a lot of our students fairly regularly, and seeing them go out and do well for themselves is easily the most special thing about coaching.”

Fostering Engagement

Bill Rich to retire after 43 years.

During his 43 years as a professor at Washburn University School of Law, Bill Rich has seen a lot of changes in legal education. Class sizes at the law school have gotten smaller, resulting in better opportunities for interactions with students. Long-time faculty members have become well versed in the art of teaching. And perhaps the biggest change of all: Technology has taken on a prominent role in interactions between students and teachers.

Rich has also seen what makes Washburn special – the rapport between faculty and students, what he calls a “strong, positive collegial relationship.” When Rich retires from Washburn this spring, it is this connection he feels is most vital for future students of the law school.

“I don’t know of any other school where there is such a constructive relationship within the faculty,” Rich said. “That is one thing that is noteworthy at Washburn and that I think we have to work to maintain as the years go on. It’s awfully tempting to sit in an office and just interact with a computer. Retaining the feeling of being part of a collegial environment is something I hope will continue.”

During his tenure as professor, Rich has primarily taught constitutional law, constitutional litigation, civil liberties, and jurisprudence courses. He has also served as the James R. Ahrens chair in torts and constitutional law, as well as associate dean of the law school for five years, acting dean in 1985, and interim dean in 2006. His scholarship has included a three-volume treatise on modern constitutional law, and he plans to continue annual updates to that publication after he retires.

Rich originally came to Washburn to work with low-income individuals through the Washburn Law Clinic, but he quickly discovered he enjoyed the classroom even more than one-on-one interactions in the clinical context.

“The very best occurs when students really become engaged, both with the material and with the learning process,” Rich said. “That can take place both in class and outside of the classroom. It’s extremely rewarding when students become excited about what they’re doing, and engagement outside of the classroom often makes the students feel as if they have accomplished something significant.”

During his four decades at Washburn, Rich has fostered engagement by working with Washburn Law Clinic students representing inmates in constitutional challenges to Kansas prison conditions, a case that went on for 19 years and resulted in a number of major changes within the Kansas Department of Corrections. Rich has also facilitated collaborations between Washburn students and a constitutional law clinic in Tbilisi, Georgia, which has provided opportunities for real-world experience and feedback. Though certain aspects of legal education have changed, Rich’s dedication to his students has remained constant.

“The faculty here have always been devoted to teaching,” Rich said. “They see that as a primary part of their responsibility. It is that shared feeling among the faculty that in turn is so nice. Maintaining that will take work, both in terms of how we go about using technology and making sure we continue doing things here at the law school that result in students staying engaged with us as a faculty.”

Mentoring Students

After 30 years, Pierce reflects on career at Washburn Law.

When it comes to his 30-year career as a professor at Washburn University School of Law, **David Pierce, '77**, says he has his wife, **Martha Pierce, bsn '77**, to thank. The couple married while they were both undergraduates at Pittsburg State University in Southeast Kansas, and Martha attended nursing school at Washburn while David studied law.

“She’s the one who told me I needed to go to law school,” David said. “She’s the one who said, ‘You know, I think you’d enjoy being a lawyer.’ That was the main direction I got, and so we came to Washburn so I could attend law school.”

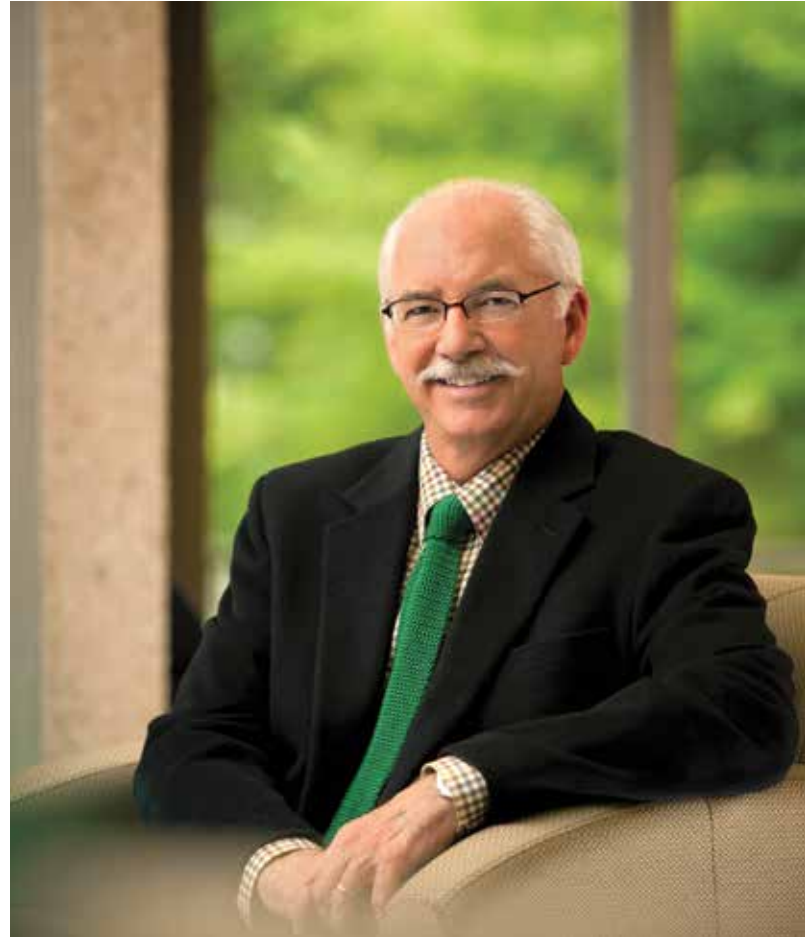
Martha may have steered David toward law school, but he always knew he loved to teach – and he always wanted to be a professor at Washburn. Even as a student, he often took the lead in study groups, and after he graduated he taught whenever he could while engaged in the practice of law. Before securing a tenure track position at Washburn in 1989, he taught at the law school twice as a visiting professor, once in 1981 and again in 1986.

When David retires next spring, he will leave behind a legacy as an authority in oil and gas, property, and contract law, as well as the gifts of guidance and mentorship to hundreds of students. David’s expertise is especially valuable because of how essential oil and gas law is in Kansas and the rest of the United States – and he has always enjoyed his time in the classroom.

“I’ve never had a class where I didn’t look forward to getting in the classroom and teaching,” he said. “I have always enjoyed it, and I hope the students did too. It has been fun.”

Although retiring, David will continue supporting the law school. “I particularly look forward to seeing the new building completed and seeing in action the new programs the law school has in the works,” he said. “Although I will not be a part of the day-to-day work of the law school, I still plan to assist when I can financially to help the law school achieve its goals. Having gone to law school at Washburn, and having worked here for over 30 years, I understand what makes Washburn special.”

In addition to the valuable role Washburn has played in his own life, David has enjoyed watching his students graduate and pursue “life after law school” in the many careers a law-trained professional can pursue.

“I have always been mindful of the many ways I have been helped by the people associated with Washburn,” David said. **Joe Morris (BA '43, JD '47, H '81)**, gave me my start as an oil and gas lawyer when he hired me to work at Shell Oil Company. Jim Concannon hired me for my tenure-track position at Washburn. Carl Monk came through with two very strategic visiting professor positions at critical times in my career. And the greatest event of my teaching career was the opportunity to come back to Washburn and work with the faculty who had a direct role in teaching me the law.”

Educating Future Lawyers

Largest law firm in Kansas looks to support future generations.

Tim O’Sullivan, ’75, had a background in psychology and mathematics and found the perfect place to combine his passions in law school.

“I wanted to practice in Kansas and Washburn University School of Law was the tenor of most recommendations,” he said. “There also seemed to be better opportunities for me in law related areas and for my wife, Pat, in her educational and job pursuits in the Topeka area while I would be attending law school.”

The recommendation proved to be good for O’Sullivan, and he went on to build a successful career in estate planning and working with families to preserve harmony after someone passes. He has served Foulston Siefkin LLP as a senior partner for almost 20 years while also teaching as an adjunct professor at Washburn Law. His unique role from both the client and education perspectives has given him insight into why the law school needs a new building.

“Legal education has become more highly specialized than it was when I started—there were far more general practitioners at that time,” he said. “It also has become more technical and automated and computers can now be used to draft and assemble complex and sophisticated documents in only a fraction of the time previously required.”

It was the change in legal education over the years that led him and many other lawyers at Foulston to make a gift toward the

new Washburn Law building. Through the generous gift, they are working to help future Washburn lawyers receive the same great education they did.

Kevin Arnel, ’87, a partner at Foulston, said the firm’s lawyers decided to make the gift because Washburn Law provided an educational foundation that helped get them to where they are today. Established in 1919, Foulston is the largest and one of the oldest law firms in Kansas. The firm has grown to nearly 90 lawyers with offices in Kansas City, Topeka, and Wichita. Washburn Law will name the professional development suite for the firm in the new building in honor of these lawyers’ generosity. The suite is composed of several interview rooms, career services resources, and professional staff offices.

“Part of why we made the gift is as a thank you and an acknowledgement,” Arnel said. “We would like the students coming out of law school to be well-equipped, and to go to work for folks like us. We wanted to invest in the future and pay it forward.”

Arnel said Foulston’s plan is to continue to grow and serve clients beyond Kansas and Missouri, expanding not only the geographic footprint but the specialty offerings the firm delivers, by investing in its own lawyers.

Cyd Gilman, ’78, who spent more than 36 years in federal criminal defense in Kansas and before the 10th Circuit Court

of Appeals before coming to Foulston, said she went into the field because she admired the work of Perry Mason on television as a young girl. She is astounded by how the field has changed since the show's time, though. In the past 30 years, the number of courses at Washburn Law has increased nearly 40 percent. This, in turn, has changed legal education, creating needs for spaces that can adapt to different technologies, provide for more group work, and for specialized centers to operate.

Gilman is pleased with what her legal education has done for her and with what Foulston does for its clients. She has gone back to Washburn Law several times and is excited for the new opportunities she didn't have when she was dreaming of becoming a lawyer.

"Washburn gave me one of my most valuable possessions in life – my law degree," she said. "Legal education has transformed itself like the practice of law and Washburn needs a facility that is able to handle all those new functions. I really want to give the students of the future the very best legal education."

This year, Foulston celebrated 100 years as a firm, and as the partners think about its future, they are focused on hiring lawyers who are practice-ready.

"As much as anything, we need smart, hard-working people who have a commitment to practice law and serving clients at a high level of excellence," said Arnel, who still benefits from the relationships he built while in school. "The school helped me develop, and I think the law building is an important next step

forward for the legal community in Kansas, the Midwest, and beyond."

One aspect of Washburn Law that won't change with the new building will be the family-like atmosphere that coincides with a legal education. O'Sullivan said he was happy to see that collegial atmosphere went beyond law school and to the firm at Foulston as well.

"I have only been with them for about 19 years, but wish I was with them my whole life," O'Sullivan said of the firm. "I came to Foulston because of their experience, reputation, and the quality of lawyers. They are extremely collegial and have a strong family atmosphere, which is why this firm has been around for so long."

Dottie worked at the University of Kansas Capitol Complex Center before joining

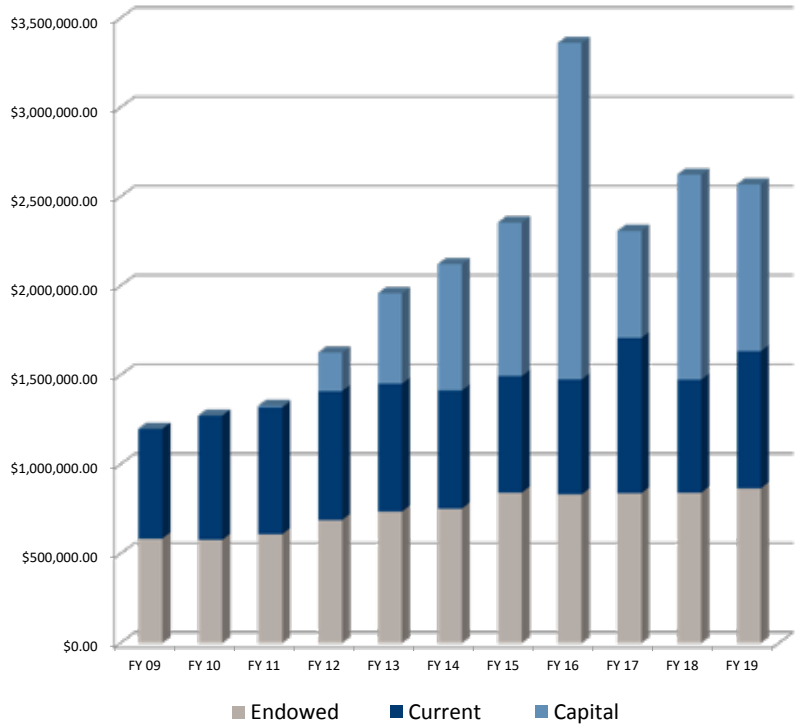

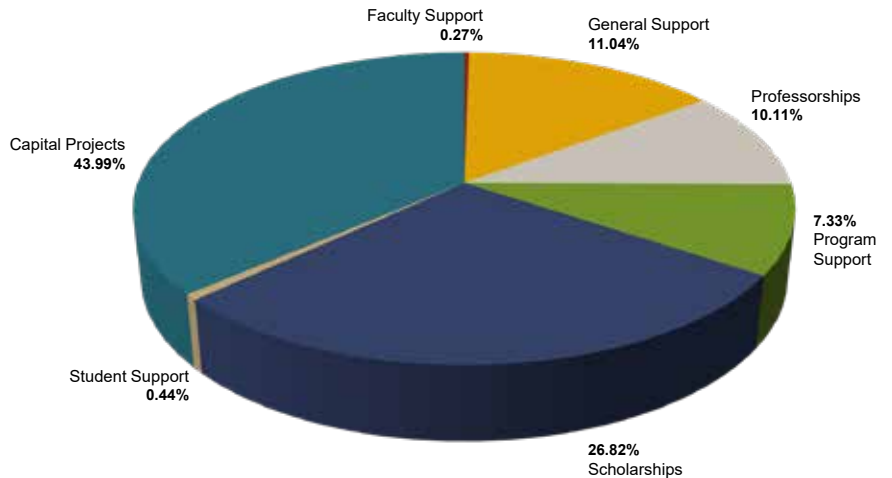
